For seasoned guitar players, or those of you who enjoy a casual strum, local guitar teacher **Dean Luke**, shares tips, advice and news about all things guitar.


CLASSIC COVER 'TOTAL CONTROL'

For this week's classic cover we will be taking a trip back to the 80's with *The Motels* hit song *Total Control*.

This song uses power chords with palm muting. To palm mute, simply rest the palm of your picking hand on the strings while you play them to achieve a "choked" sound. Use palm muting with all of the following chords.


Verse

D G A D



Chorus

E F# G A



Play the D power chord in the beginning of the verse with 2 lots of 8 down strokes. Then play the G with 8 down strokes, the A with 8 down strokes, then resolve back to the D with 2 lots of 8 down strokes.

For the chorus play the E and F# with 4 downstrokes respectively, then 8 downstrokes on the G and 2 lots of 8 downstrokes on the A.

Warning: This song may induce 80's flash backs. Symptoms include hallucinations of mullets and shoulder pads, and the smell of hair spray and perms.

Kids Teach Kids During Environmental Leadership Program

Young student leaders from 18 primary schools across Victoria descended on Phillip Island on 9 September for environmental leadership workshops as part of the Target Kids Teaching Kids Week activities. Hosted by education rangers from Phillip Island Nature Parks, the Phillip Island event was the culmination of a Coastal Ambassadors Young Environmental Leaders program, an education program sponsored by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development. During the event, students conducted presentations on what they had learnt from implementing their environmental action plans in their schools, sharing their first hand experiences and knowledge. The program was designed to engage students with the environment and empower them to make a difference.

“It was great to see the students so enthusiastic when teaching others about environmental issues,” Cara Richardson, Education Ranger, said. The Target Kids Teaching Kids Week is a nationwide program where more than 10,000 kids from across Australia participate in one of 500 events, and focus their knowledge and passion for the environment through comedy, songs, theatrical performances and science workshops. Throughout its 15 years, Kids Teaching Kids has been enlisting kids as green army recruits. Their mission: to educate themselves, their classmates and their communities about issues like

climate change, conservation, energy, water, and population growth. The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development is a major sponsor of Phillip Island Nature Parks' Coastal Ambassadors and Coastal Ambassadors Young Environmental Leaders programs through the Strategic Partnership Program.

High Probability of Success from Recent Statistics Course

Phillip Island Nature Parks hosted two eminent international experts on ecological modelling and statistics during a week-long course held last week at the Penguin Parade. Dr Alain Zuur from Scotland and Dr Elena Ieno from Spain have written a total of 8 books and facilitated over 150 courses around the globe, and are considered as world leaders in their field.

The course was aimed at providing protocols for data exploration to avoid common statistical problems. Participants were presented with several case studies which integrated statistical theory with applied analyses in a clear and understandable manner.

There was significant interest from around the world, with some course attendees travelling from as far afield as France, Spain, Oman and New Zealand, while several attended from New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia and Victoria.

For many delegates, this was their first visit to Phillip Island, and the overwhelming feedback was how much they enjoyed the picturesque location of Cowes and the friendly welcomes they received at their accommodations. Many will return home with stories of the beautiful scenery and varied wildlife of Phillip Island.

Dr Rebecca McIntosh, Research Scientist with Phillip Island Nature Parks, organised the event and commented: “This course was presented in an accessible and enjoyable style, and will certainly lead to improved interpretation and presentation of research questions.”

“This course was a great success,” Dr McIntosh went on to say. “There was a great deal of interest in the advanced course scheduled for 2016, with many delegates very keen to return to Phillip Island next year.”

Slow Cooked Spicy Beef

In our house we're big fans of slow cooked, melt in your mouth meats that you can wrap up in a warm flat bread. Quick to prepare and delicious to eat, you just need to remember to put it on to cook early enough in the day so it can do its thing while you're doing your's.

This Mexican inspired dish is just the ticket for cool nights and hungry appetites.

What you need

- 1 kg chuck steak
- 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 400g tin diced Italian tomatoes
- 1 tbs ground cumin
- 3 bay leaves
- 1 tbs balsamic vinegar
- 1 cup beef stock
- 1 fresh red chilli, finely sliced
- 1 tbs soy sauce



To serve

Guacamole, Sour cream, Shredded lettuce, Warm tortillas

What you do

Heat some olive oil in an oven proof saucepan. Brown the beef, onions, garlic and chilli.

Add the spices, vinegar, soy, stock and tomatoes.

Cover and cook in a slow oven (about 140C) for 3 hours or so until the meat is falling apart. Adjust seasoning and add water along the way if needed.

Quick Guacamole

Mash an avocado with some good mayonnaise and a squeeze of lime juice.

Mix through a tablespoon each of diced red onion and fresh tomato and a little fresh red chilli to taste.


Assembly

Gently warm some tortillas or flat breads in a hot, dry fry pan until the tortillas puff and colour slightly.

Serve with the guacamole, a dollop of sour cream and some shredded lettuce.





CONSIDER YOUR VERDICT

Join Leon Herbert in the Courtroom

THE TRIAL OF MRS ANGELA BATTONBURY

No thrillers of fiction can match the extraordinary cases that have taken place inside the Old Bailey and the aftermath, and few people have been in such a privileged position to witness many of them, in addition to being the barrister for a defendant, such as in this instance *The Vibe's* resident barrister and part time sleuth, Leroy Cunningworth Q.C. This case revealed the terrible

exposure of the sort of thing that can go on in a quiet domestic house in England or, for that matter even Phillip Island.

Francis Battonbury, an

architect from Canada, had been divorced and married the woman in the case, Angela. He was then in his late fifties and his bride a woman of thirty. A child was born of the marriage and thereafter the couple ceased to live as man and wife. They were, however, ostensibly quite happy and Francis wanted nothing more than companionship, whatever frustration his wife may have felt.

He was a generous man and allowed her a housekeeping budget which was more than sufficient for their pleasant but modest little home in Sussex called "Villa Madeira". The swimming pool and garden needed regular care and a muscular handsome twenty-one year old George Stoner, who lived with his grandfather in a nearby house, applied for and got the job after reading an advert for the position. They offered him a room in the house in return for also doing various other chores that seemed beyond the expertise of the resident maid who appeared quite fond of Francis but not Angela. George's grandfather seemed happy to be rid of looking after his grandson who, so he told his mates at the village pub, was proving to be very difficult to live with since the death of his parents.

Within a matter of days, Angela and George were lovers. Whether Francis suspected what was going on or not will never be known. It seems unlikely in such a small household that he could have been totally unaware of the situation, for the evidence indicated the lovers were not

very discreet. The evidence revealed it was more than probable he was ready to acquiesce in it. On the other hand Angela gave the impression to most visitors to her home that her affection was mostly maternal. She worked hard to correct George's social deficits and to teach him proper manners apart from also probably educating him on a physical level.

The household lived quite amicably until early spring that year when an exceptionally fine period of weather uncharacteristically tempted Francis to invite Angela to accompany him on a drive into the country where they could enjoy a picnic. George overheard the conversation and took the first opportunity of waylaying his mistress and warning her in the presence of the maid 'I will kill you if you go on that trip.'

Angela took no notice of this remark, for it was not the first time he had made moody threats through what seemed the unsatisfied pangs of testosterone charged jealousy. But at 11 o'clock that night the maid in the house was aroused by Angela screaming.

The girl hurried downstairs and found her mistress in her pyjamas crying: 'Oh poor Batty, what have they done to you.' Angela was stooping over a big armchair in which her husband sat with his head tilted back as if he was asleep. One eye was bruised and on the floor by the side of the chair was a pool of blood. The three deep wounds at the back of the skull were hidden by the back of the chair. George Stoner was called. He came downstairs and was sent to get the car out to fetch the doctor, who the maid was attempting to phone but couldn't get through to.

It took three days for Francis to die and in that time he did not regain consciousness. When the doctor saw the extent of the injuries he called the police. They arrived to find the house blazing with light, the radio blaring and Angela walking up and down the room with a tumbler of whisky in her hand.

She was in an advanced state of drunken hysteria and the police officers could make little of what she was saying beyond the fact that there had been an armed intruder; information which was soon contradicted by her claiming that she herself struck her husband. After an hour of searching for clues and trying to get a statement from her, during which time her hysteria gave way to complete drunkenness, leaving her laughing and singing and also now and then trying to kiss the officers. They left her alone until the following morning.

She then insisted she had struck her husband, and there was nothing to be done but to formally charge her with intent to murder.



Angela's friends were horrified at what they regarded as the obtuseness of the police and they insisted she wouldn't hurt a fly. The police took note of this evidence because they themselves already recognised that a brutal attack of this kind with some kind of axe was quite uncharacteristic of a female murderer, but when the maid told them of the love affair with Stoner, they arrested him. Until then he had continued living quietly in the house, going about his daily jobs and being so self-effacing that he had hardly been noticed. As soon as he was in custody his first remark was: 'Do you know Mrs Battonbury had nothing to do with this affair.' Leroy Cunningworth Q.C. was engaged to defend both the lovers charged with the death of Francis Battonbury. This attempt to shoulder all the blame himself was paralleled by Angela's endeavour to do the same in order to allow Stoner to go free, was an almost unique example in a murder case of two lovers fighting with all their might to take the blame, irrespective of the facts.

But in the trial before Mr Justice Hargreaves, Leroy was able to establish that Angela was probably unaware of the assault on her husband until a noise brought her downstairs. As was to be expected the prosecutor played heavily on the adulterous relationship of the two accused and the obvious and clear motive for wanting the husband dead. Although the murder weapon was never found and there was no incriminating DNA evidence, he argued there was equally no evidence of an armed intruder. The facts screamed out for conviction of the only two persons in the house who had clear and obvious motive for wanting Francis Battonbury dead. The prosecutor Pringle Q.C. urged the jury to find that Stoner had physically done the heinous deed assisted in no small part by his seducer, lover and teacher in all things evil, namely Angela Battonbury.

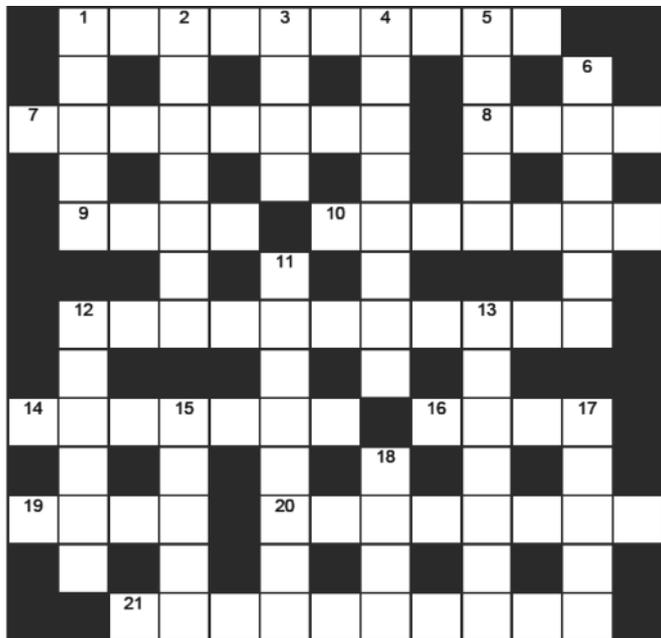



VERDICT


