MIKE FOENANDER & ROB WATSON ROCKSTARS

*Wanna be a Rockstar?? Or maybe you know someone who'd love a few minutes of fame? Email us at **The Vibe** and we can turn you into a celebrity overnight.*



Vibe: What do you guys do?

Rob: I've been retired on the Island since 1998. Before that I worked in advertising and did a lot of work for Honda. We had a set up at the Track so I ended up spending more and more time down here until my wife and I eventually decided to do the sea change thing and move permanently.

Mike: I'm a partner at Stockdale & Leggo but started work on the Island as the bank manager at the National Bank about 30 years ago.

Vibe: So what do you guys get up to in your spare time?

Mike & Rob: We've been playing in a band called *Frankie & the Highlighters* for the past six months or so. They're a 5 piece outfit playing 50's and 60's rock 'n' roll.

Vibe: Is this a new thing for you guys or have you been involved in music for a while?

Rob & Mike: We've both been playing in bands for about 50 years.

Vibe: Wow! Our readers would love to hear all the nitty gritty.

Mike: I started playing drums when I was 12 for *Hans Poulsen*. He used to write songs for *John Farnham* and even for *The Beatles*. By the time I was 16 we formed a band called *Strings Unlimited* and we were looking for a lead singer. That's when *John Farnham* joined – he was 14 at the time. We spent the next few years playing the Melbourne hotel circuit.

After that I joined a band called *The Diamonds* and we regularly appeared on *The Go Show* on Channel O and we did the Melbourne circuit including *431 Club*, *Opus Swinger*, *Gas Works* and *The Thumpin Tum*. Events turned and I was conscripted in 1968 and served in Malaya so unfortunately I missed some of the 'celebrity' stuff while I

was doing active service.

When I got back from Malaya I was posted all over Victoria as a bank manager. For a couple of years there I was working in Elsternwick and would commute daily over summer back and forth to the Island. Bank manager by day, keyboard player by night. Originally the post office was where Isola de Capri is now so when it relocated, the building was turned into a dance hall. It was packed every night over summer and the Carnival was just over the road on the foreshore. It was really buzzing in those days. When I moved to Cowes permanently I started playing with Issy Poro at Banfields. Issy and I still play at events around the place.

Rob: I started a school band when I was about 12. We were called *The Outlaws* and we played all the town hall dances. I then joined a band called *The Avengers* who played covers of *The Shadows* (a huge band in the 60's for all you young people out there). *The Avengers* were the backing band for *Bobby Young* so we played all around the country, as well as backing for the likes of *Olivia Newton John*, *Johnny Young* and *Mike Ferber*.

By the late 60's I got married and started a family so music didn't play as big a role for a few years. So when I moved down here permanently I was really keen to get back into music again. I joined a band called *The Shedows*. After that I formed *Rockhouse* which Mike joined in 2012.



Vibe: So it's great that you guys are now playing in a band together. What keeps you motivated with music?

Rob: It's our "basket weaving class".

Vibe: Therapeutic?

Rob: Yeah definitely. It keeps you sane.

Mike: And it's fantastic watching people having so much fun when we're performing. Everyone really gets into dancing so the atmosphere is always energetic. There are some really good rock 'n' roll dancers on the Island and we love playing at their gigs.

Vibe: What do you like about living on the Island?

Rob: No traffic lights – almost. I also really like the casual lifestyle and friendly people. Everyone knows everyone which I much prefer to the city. The day I moved down here I went down Thompson Ave to buy a sandwich and I didn't get home for over an hour – everyone just stopped and chatted. I wouldn't move back to the city for a million bucks.

Mike: It's so peaceful. I love the fishing, golf and the tranquillity. I'm also involved in a lot of fund raising and charity work which I find very rewarding.

Vibe: So when does the music stop?

Rob: I reckon we'll still be doing this when we're in wheelchairs.

Record year for Hooded Plovers on Phillip Island

The Hooded Plover is listed as a vulnerable bird in Victoria, but the 2014/15 breeding year has seen the highest number of chicks fledge in the 23 years of record-keeping.

A total of 12 chicks are confirmed to have fledged on Phillip Island, with an unconfirmed 13th chick thought to have made it through to this stage. Rangers from Phillip Island Nature Parks and a band of dedicated and highly valued volunteers have been maintaining vigil ever since



the first nest was discovered on 13 September 2014.

Hooded plovers nest along the coast on beaches and in sand dunes during the busy summer months, so they are prone to disturbance and thus low breeding success. The Hooded Plover Watch program is conducted from late spring to early autumn, with counts of all birds on beaches held quarterly to monitor the species in the long term.

Some of the duties performed by Rangers and volunteers include: increasing public awareness through direct contact with the public, finding and monitoring nest progress, nest warden duties, nest progress signs on

access points, beach cleaning to remove hazardous rubbish, pest plant and animal control, and entering nest progress into the electronic portal, just to name a few.

Jarvis Weston, Ranger in Charge of Environment with Phillip Island Nature Parks stated: 'It was a great relief that there was successful breeding on the south coast this year, as only one chick had fledged on the south coast since the 2010-11 season.'

The Hooded Plover population on Phillip Island has doubled since active management began in 1998 and their range has dramatically increased to include most of the beaches on the island. This bucks the trend for many other 'hoodie' populations in the south eastern corner of Australia where their numbers continue to decline.

Mr Weston went on to say: 'This success is a testament to the vigilance and effort of our volunteers, working alongside Nature Parks' Rangers for a long period of time, and I would like to thank them for their continued support'.







What's Cooking?

Simple, delicious recipes.
No experience necessary.

Marmalade Muffins

These zesty little muffins are simply delightful with a cup of tea or equally suitable with a strong espresso. How versatile you are little muffin!

Because the recipe uses marmalade rather than fresh fruit this is a great way to use up some of those homemade preserves from last summer's citrus harvest which may have accumulated in the back of the pantry or fridge. While orange marmalade is more traditional, I quite like using cumquat as it just has a little extra tangy kick. This recipe makes 12 decent sized muffins.

And if you think you're not going to get through them all at once then you can successfully freeze muffins to be enjoyed at a later date. Wait until the muffins are completely cold then place them in an airtight plastic box in the freezer. When you're feeling peckish simply defrost the muffins then pop them in a quick oven for a couple of minutes. They will smell, look and taste freshly baked. And no-one will be the wiser.

What you need

2 1/2 cups self-raising flour
1/3 cup caster sugar
125g butter
1 cup marmalade
1 cup milk
2 free range eggs

What you do

Preheat oven to 200C.

Place patty pans in a 12 muffin tray.

Sift flour in a large bowl and gently stir in sugar. Create a well in the centre.

Put the butter and marmalade in a small saucepan and melt on low heat. Allow to cool a little.

Whisk together the milk and eggs in a jug and pour into the well.

Add the butter/marmalade mixture.

Fold it all together very gently with a large metal spoon. Make sure not to overmix. You basically want the mixture to be quite lumpy and barely blended. If you're over vigorous with the mixing then the muffins will be tough as an old boot. One of the rare times in life when you're better off to work against your gut feeling.

Divide the mixture amongst the 12 patty pans and bake for about 20 minutes until muffins are golden and gorgeous.



CONSIDER YOUR VERDICT

Join Leon Herbert in the Courtroom

THE MURDER OF LORD BLACK

"All persons having anything to do before my Lords the Queen's Justices of Oyer and Terminer and general gaol delivery, for the jurisdiction of the Central Criminal Court, held this day by adjournment, draw near and give your attendance. God save the Queen."

This solemn introduction has been heard at the famous Old Bailey in the City of London for more than 100 years. It was now repeated as the Court was in session to hear what seemed likely to be an intriguing murder trial. You the reader, playing juror, will be called upon to consider your verdict. 'They're mine and I'm going to. Why only last November, you were begging me to sell.' Margie Black was a sensible girl and she seconded her mother's feelings.

'Don't keep them for my sake, Daddy. Enough of Cecil's money survived the crash. If ever I need diamonds, I'm sure my future husband will provide.'

Captain Cecil Andrews held a family pedigree even more distinguished than the Black's. 'Within reason,' the young aristocrat chortled. 'Lucky for me, our Margie is not that fond of jewellery.'

The fifth and final member of the group raised her voice in disbelief. Katie Blowhard was Margie's best friend from school and as full of life as Margie was drab and proper.

Suddenly Lord Black exclaimed that he had seen something move in the garden. The butler checked but no one was around and the guests appeared to relax. As the party broke up, Lord Black swept the diamonds into their velvet pouch. 'I think I'll keep these in my bedroom. Better than the safe. Someone was definitely prowling around,' he said in a serious tone.

It was shortly after midnight when the first gunshot was heard. Lady Black emerged from her second-floor boudoir. Captain Andrews came down the stairway from the third floor guest bedroom and his fiancée ran up the stairs from the library. All three approached Lord Black's suite only to find the door locked.

A second gunshot thundered through the hall and was quickly followed by a dull thud. The Captain kicked the door open just a few seconds later. They found Lord Black on the floor behind the desk, dead, a bullet hole in his head, clutched in his hand was a fireplace poker. The Captain noticed the open desk drawer and the revolver lying in the bottom of it. But it was Lady Black who noticed the empty velvet pouch and that one of the windows was open.

Exactly one month later, Lord Black's accused killer comes to trial. "*Kat Blowhard, the Deadly Cat Burglar,*" proclaimed one front page of a leading English newspaper.

After the witnesses gave their evidence the Crown and the Defence closed their cases. It was time for you the jury to be addressed by learned counsel.

Keith Sinclair Q.C. for the prosecution: 'You have seen her picture a hundred times. But sitting here in the box in Her Majesty's Court, this daring woman with a lust for precious gems is even more attractive than you imagined. She saw the dumbwaiter as a perfect means. By squeezing her petite and well-dressed silky frame into this mini-elevator and pulling the ropes, she managed to lift herself unseen from the dining room to her victim's bedroom, where she killed her host, stole the diamonds, then retraced her route. Paste replicas had been found hidden in the chute. Thank goodness she was seen by the butler to be leaving the dumbwaiter soon after the second shot was heard otherwise justice might not have been served. The case against her is open and shut. Naturally the diamonds



are not to be found.'

Counsel looked knowingly at the jury, certain they would render a guilty verdict, bowed to the Judge and with

a flourish sat down looking like a cat that had swallowed the cream.

Leroy Cunningworth Q.C. for the defence: 'It's not like it looks, ladies and gentlemen of the jury. You have heard that my client only entered the dumbwaiter as a lark, nothing more, nothing less. There is no reason to disbelieve her. Consider the facts and the probabilities and find my client not guilty. Remember the deceased saw someone lurking about shortly before his death. Forensics have not proven my client fired the weapon. No one saw her do it and remember the bedroom door was locked. It's ludicrous to believe the accused in her slim fitting dress scaled the wall and entered the Lord's bedroom. You cannot convict my client on the basis of a visitation to the dumbwaiter,' he exclaimed. 'The butler in this instance does not know all and you are too intelligent to believe the accused committed murder or burglary.'

Leroy in his usual eloquent and composed manner proceeded to paint several compelling exculpatory scenarios for the benefit of the jury.

'I therefore respectfully urge you to find the accused not guilty.' He tugged the lapels of his gown, adjusted his wig and quietly returned to his seat smiling only briefly at his client who was sitting demurely and dewy eyed in the dock.
