Perfect Start to Prep



Newhaven College's Preps arrived for their first day of school relaxed and ready to learn after attending the college's new Prep Transition program last year.

In two small classes, the students are able to receive a great deal of individual attention from teachers Fiona Smart and Linda Austin who attributed the smooth start to the year to the student's familiarity with the classroom and each other, due to the extensive transition program that took place during 2016.

They were so relaxed and comfortable with each other and also in the classroom after attending the carefully planned Prep Transition Program."

The transition program involved one session each week in different areas of the school where children met teachers and experienced different aspects of the school program such as music, dance and drama, in an informal setting.

Phillip Island Walkabout

As a local walker, I'll be sharing stunning visuals that are abundant around our coastline in the coming issues, creating awareness of popular walks and my favourite less known walks with you all; hopefully motivating you to go out and experience this Island for yourselves.

The coastline circumference is 97km, about a third is privately owned, inaccessible or mangroves, leaving about 70km to walk. Our walks are carved up into 5, 10 to 20km coastal walks designed to consider winds and tides. These two elements can make or break a walk in this environment. Always wear sunscreen, a hat, long sleeves (preferably) and carry water. I also carry a \$5 windbreaker I got from Dimmeys when it first opened, as it is perfect for every condition (expect torrential rain!).

I'm starting where the heart is for our first 5km walk, my home ground and regular walk, Ventnor to Summerlands. If there are two of you, drop a car off at Cat Bay, Summerlands; then return to Grossard Point, Ventnor. Head down the stairs to the right of the car park and around McHaffie Reef along the beach heading towards the Nobbies.

On the journey you will witness the colours in the aged rocks displayed above, look out for Trevanin Park Chapel sitting on the hill to the left just as the Nobbies come into view about 1.5km into it. Once you pass Trevanin Park, Flynn's Surf beach is next about 3.5km along where surfers are out enjoying the waves. Finally, you will encounter the remains of Cat Bay Jetty, built in the 1930's when the area was being prepared to become a playground for the wealthy, which the pending world war put an end to. Time to take the next walkway up to the car park.

What's Cooking?

Simple, delicious recipes.
No experience necessary.

It's common at this year to see an abundance of aromatic and plump tomatoes ripening on window sills or being passed over the back fence to the neighbours so here's a recipe to help you make good use of those delicious fruits while they're around in numbers.

FRESH TOMATO SOUP

WHAT YOU NEED:

750g ripe tomatoes (peeled and quartered)
25g butter
1 onion, sliced
1 carrot, sliced
1 tablespoon plain flour
3 cups chicken or vegetable stock
Pinch ground mace (optional)

WHAT YOU DO:

Melt butter in large pan and add onion and carrot. Cover and cook over low heat for 5-10 minutes. Remove pan from heat and stir in flour.

Add tomatoes, stock and mace (if using) and season to taste.

Bring to boil, cover and simmer 20-30 mins. Puree the soup either in an electric food blender or by pressing through a sieve and return to the rinsed out pan. Eat and enjoy.

TOMATO FUN FACT NUMBER ONE:

Largest plant. The largest tomato plant (a "Sungold" variety), recorded in 2000, reached 19.8 meters (65 feet) in length and was grown by Nutriculture Ltd. of Mawdesley, Lancashire, UK.

TOMATO FUN FACT NUMBER TWO:

Heinz tomato sauce is made to a thickness that ensures that it comes out of the bottle at a speed of 2.5cm per second.

HANDY HINT FOR TOMATO PEELING

There are several methods for peeling tomatoes but my go to is the boiling method.

Bring a large ppt of water to the boil and place a bowl of ice water next to the stove so it is easily accessible.

Using a sharp knife, slice a shallow X into the bottom of the tomato. Gently place the tomatoes into the boiling water for about 30 seconds, rescue them and dunk in iced water to cool them down and stop any cooking and they should then peel easily from the bottom.







GRIFFITHS POINT – SAN REMO??

Griffiths Point was named after John Griffiths. Griffiths and his schooner the 'Elizabeth' were commissioned to collect wattle bark from Westernport in the 1830's, and the point where he loaded his bounty acquired his name.

Thomas and Lillian Bergin and their four children were an influential family who owned the General Store and built the San Remo Hotel next door at Griffiths Point in the 1880's.

The hotel's name was chosen following a family holiday to a little town in Italy called San Remo. The town was situated on the beach but bore little resemblance to Griffiths Point, regardless the family adopted the name for their new Hotel.


On their return from the holiday, they liked the name so much that a town meeting was held and an undisputed vote for the name change came into effect immediately. From 1888 Griffiths Point was known as San Remo.

Thomas died in the early 1890's and Lillian died in the late 1890's in their 70's with the family property staying in the family for over 50 years, finally being all sold off in 1937. Local news tells of the Bergin's moored boat being sunk in a horrendous storm, and another of their boat's oars being stolen and their successful retrieval of payment for said oars, then a story of their boat being accidentally launched and dragged out quickly by

the current, where it became stuck upon a rock. Luckily as the tide subsided the boat could be rescued this time.

Their daughter became the pianist that performed at all the local outings.

STRIKING A CHORD



ROCKIN' RHYTHM


PART II - PERCUSSIVE RHYTHM

Today in the 2nd instalment of this 2 part rhythm series we will be looking at how to apply a percussive element to the Down, Down Up, Up Down Up strumming pattern outlined in the previous issue.

Instead of strumming the 2nd and 5th down stroke of our strumming pattern we will be striking the strings to create a percussive "snare drum" kind of sound.



The strike that we use is a combination of hitting the strings with the palm of our strumming hand and strumming the strings while muting them with the palm of our strumming hand.



With the combination of the "string hitting sound" and the "muted strum sound" we achieve a great percussive sound that can spice up any strumming pattern.

Like in the previous issue the above diagram shows where the strums take place within the 4 beats of a bar, but this time we have our percussive strikes.

Each beat has been divided into two half's.

Set a metronome to around 60 BPM, count 1, 2, 3, 4 along with the beats of the metronome. Now divide those beats into two half's and point to each half on the above diagram along with the beats of the metronome. Now say out loud the direction of the strums and the strikes as they appear in the beats (Down, STRIKE Up, Up STRIKE Up) and you will be able to hear the rhythm of this strumming pattern with the percussive strikes.



Get Growing

Ideas & tips from a
time poor gardener

FEBRUARY IN THE GARDEN

As we farewell the last of our delicious summer fruits and vegies, it's time to start thinking about autumn planting. Don't forget to love and enjoy your garden. At this time of year wait until the heat of the day is gone and then spend some time admiring your creation. Weeding is a great job to do at this time of year. Cut down the competition between your tasty treats and these space invaders, and tidy up your patch. It may sound tedious, but it's incredibly rewarding!

Top up the mulch on your vegetable patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds. This is especially important if you are heading away or caught up in the bustle of getting back into a routine. A hot summer tip is to mulch after watering the patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Choose a mulch that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.

This is the time to think about what you will be planting this year and where in your garden you're planning for it to go. Preparing beds and plots now means that when autumn planting time rolls around, your garden will be ready and waiting.

Water smarter at this time of year and first thing in the morning is best. A nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial than frequent, short watering.

For frost free or occasional light frost areas give leeks, capsicum, chillies, cabbage, silverbeet, lettuce, sweet corn, cauliflower, broccoli and tomatoes a go towards the end of the month.

It's too hot for most herbs, but you could try some lemongrass. Wait until the end of the month to plant some basil varieties, including our old favourite sweet basil, and the always-stunning purple basil.

Pretty up the patch with some marigolds and sunflowers. Planting these around your veggies will give some colour and interest to the patch, and act as beneficial insect attractors.

For cool to cold areas that experience low temperatures for extended periods of time (all of Tasmania, most of Victoria, the southern highlands of NSW, the ACT and a tiny southern bit of SA)

It is still fairly warm around these parts, but there are a number of incredible edibles ready to go in now. Try lettuce, spinach, leek, silverbeet, and some Asian greens towards the tail end of the month. Broccoli, leeks and spring onions could be worth a shot as the nights get cooler.

Add some colour and movement to the patch, and pop in some of these little pretties: stock, dianthus, viola, pansy, verbena and ageratum.



Give most herbs a miss just now, but, if you're really keen, get rolling with parsley and watercress.

Garlic is good to go once the weather cools a touch.

Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds. A hot summer tip is to mulch after watering the patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems....especially young seedlings. Choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.

Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect, especially for the seedlings shoved in at the tail end of last year. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
