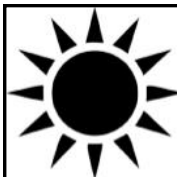

The Vibe is always out and about checking out what's happening around The Rock. In this issue *The Vibe* visits **Café Lugano**, a long established café in Cowes with a brand new look.



Café Lugano in Thompson Avenue has just undergone a huge facelift. Gone is the pink façade that has adorned the café for many years and it's been replaced with a sleek and modern new look and logo.

New owner, Sam Sidhu, is keen to breathe fresh life into *Café Lugano* and to his credit he has taken the bold step of transforming a café that has remained the same for some time. Not an easy task, but one which Sam is undertaking with enthusiasm, energy and passion.

The interior is cool and chic and while original artist canvasses still hug the walls, the overall feel to *Café Lugano* suggests a more industrial, minimalist tone.

While Sam has carefully designed the refurbishment of *Café Lugano*, ultimately it's the food and flavour that takes paramount importance for Sam who has spent the past ten years working as a chef in numerous cafes and restaurants in Melbourne. The diversity of his cooking experience and exposure to international cuisines means that Sam brings the tastes of the globe to all the food that he carefully and thoughtfully prepares at *Café Lugano*. Behind the scenes Sam is assisted by his wife Raman who, when not studying for her medical degree, skilfully adds her own touch to the mouth-watering dishes that come out of the kitchen.

Long standing breakfast favourites sit comfortably on the menu alongside offerings such as *saffron rice pudding cooked with pistachio, cashew, almonds and sultanas*. Lunchtime sees a colourful array of dishes such as: *super quinoa and Israeli couscous salad with dukkha, roast vegetables and pomegranate vinaigrette, tandoori chicken wrap and Char Sui pork with saffron rice and pickled vegetables*.

Sam is currently extending the al fresco courtyard which promises a pleasant, breezy atmosphere on hot summer's days. With a liquor licence almost in place, Sam plans to open for dinner a couple of nights a week when the weather warms up. Sipping a wine, beer, cocktail or spritzer while sampling a range of tapas dishes sounds like a cruisy way to spend a warm evening. Something to look forward to!



Sam's experience in hospitality tells him that change has to happen at a measured pace and that a smart chef responds to the feedback from his customers. So expect the menu to change frequently.

Café Lugano still serves the same great coffee and now has loyalty cards offering fifty cents off each coffee purchase. There's truly something for everyone at this inviting, friendly café. So next time you're heading down Thompson Ave make sure you take a fresh look at *Café Lugano*.

The Green Army Marches on Phillip Island

Members of the Green Army proudly attended their graduation ceremony at the Koala Conservation Centre today, following a 23 week program of extensive environmental works in and around Phillip Island.

The Green Army offers young people aged between 17 and 24 the opportunity to gain practical training and experience while working in their local environment, and is an initiative of the Australian Government.



As a shared project, the group was coordinated and supervised by Conservation Volunteers Australia, and sponsored by the dedicated staff at Phillip Island Nature Parks, Bass Coast Shire Council and Landcare.

During their time, the nine members of the Green Army took on a range of tasks including the erection of 600 metres of wallaby-proof fencing at the Koala Conservation Centre and revegetation projects at Oswin Roberts Reserve, Fiveways Reserve, the Ventnor Koala Reserve and the recently opened Scenic Estate Conservation Reserve. In all, approximately 40,000 grasses, shrubs and trees were planted across these reserves, as well as in the Bass Hills. There was also significant removal of woody weeds in Oswin Roberts Reserve, Summerlands Peninsula and Observation Point, at the mouth of the Rhyll Inlet wetlands. Tolly Das, Regional Manager Gippsland, for Conservation Volunteers Australia, said: "Through this project the group has not only delivered some tangible benefit to their local environment they also learned substantial experience on job related skills and training in conservation and land management that will improve their future career opportunity."

Daniel Kallstrom, Phillip Island Nature Parks Ranger, commented: "We were fortunate to have a group of young, enthusiastic participants interested in both learning about, and contributing to, the ongoing conservation and environmental activities undertaken here on Phillip Island."

The graduates were introduced to Cr Kimberley Brown, Mayor of Bass Coast Shire, and the Honourable Mr Brian Paynter MP, Member for Bass, before being presented with their certificates by the Honourable Mr Greg Hunt, Minister for the Environment. Following the presentations, participants and visitors undertook site tours of both the Koala Conservation Centre and Scenic Estate Conservation Reserve to witness first hand some of the results of their efforts.

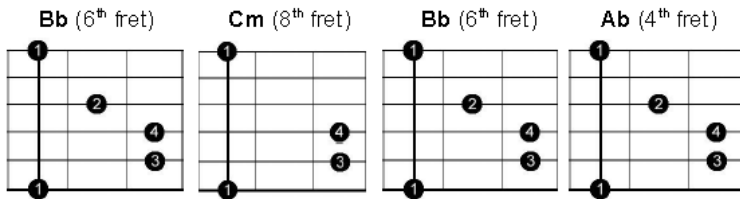
STRIKING A CHORD

CLASSIC COVER 'ALL ALONG THE WATCHTOWER'

For this week's classic cover we have an iconic rock song written and recorded by Bob Dylan and covered by none other than Jimi Hendrix. I am of course talking about *All Along The Watchtower!*

We are going to be playing the song's three main chords using barre chords, so get your Fender Statocaster, Marshall amplifier, Wah pedal and afro comb ready because things are about to get loud!



The above barre chords have the fret number the chord is played in brackets next to the chord name. The strumming for the above chord progression goes as follow:

- 2 down strums on the B flat.
- 4 down strums on the C minor.
- 2 down strums on the B flat.
- 4 down strums on the A flat.

Recipes from *The Cape Kitchen* Rhubarb Crumble

Spring has Sprung! And with its sunshine we welcome lots of lovely, bright produce. What better way to start Spring then with a delicious, warm dessert favourite.

Ingredients

500g rhubarb, chopped into chunks the length of your thumb
100g golden caster sugar
3 tbsp port (optional)
140g self-raising flour
85g butter, chilled
50g brown sugar
50g chopped walnuts (optional)

Method

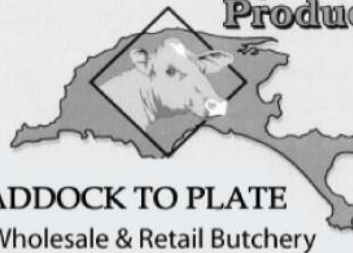
Tip the rhubarb into a saucepan with the sugar and port, if using. Cover and simmer on a very low heat for 15 mins, adding more sugar if you want. When soft (but still holding its shape) and sweet enough, pour the rhubarb into a medium baking dish.

Heat oven to 180C.
To make the topping, rub the flour and butter together with your fingers until you have a soft, crumbly topping. Now add the sugar and nuts, mixing together with your hands.



Scatter the topping over the rhubarb and bake for 30 mins or until golden brown on top. Serve hot with a dollop of Gippsland cream.

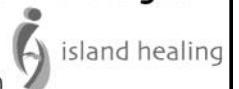

Courtroom*

THE TRIAL OF THE RISING SUN

His behavior in court was uncannily serene.

Throughout the five long days of the hearing John Fallows listened with interest but perfect calmness to the ominously damning circumstantial evidence. He heard details of the secretive and the immoral side of his life revealed with relentless insistence. Yet he seemed to

regard the entire trial with more objective attention than any of the gaping members of the public in the court.

The accused passed the time

making life like sketches of the courtroom, the Judge and the faces of witnesses and legal personalities; his barrister and a few of his colleagues managed to secure some of the sketches as souvenirs. Those that his barrister saw were perfect cameos, reviving in his mind exactly the impression of character as well as appearance of the person concerned.

The murder with which John Fallows was accused revealed something of the nightlife of an ostensibly conventional section of middle class London society at that time and the picture that was drawn with such care and in such detail during that memorable trial was not a pretty one.

Shaw worked for the railway service travelling between London and Sheffield; he was away from home for roughly 24 hours and then had 24 hours off. His live-in lady friend was Phyllis, and his routine meant that she was left on her own to a great extent. Shaw was aware that before she came to live with him she had pursued an immoral life but whether he really believed that she had abandoned it, as she had promised to do, was doubtful. She did at least conceal her activities from him as much as she could.

There were plenty of pubs in the nearby district and they provided a cheap version of the glittering West End; they were populated mainly by women of the town and visited by clerks and provincial businessmen who were

out for an inexpensive good time where they could "see life". It was here that Phyllis in her second-best clothes was a frequent visitor. In the early evening she made the rounds of the bars including her favourite, "The Rising Sun". On the previous three nights she met a ship's cook there and on at least one of the nights had taken him home with her but on this particular night she had not as he was later able to prove in court with a cast iron alibi - a fact which did not worry Phyllis, who, as the barmaid observed, was clearly expecting someone else.

The meeting she had planned presumably took place for Phyllis was not in the bar when closing time approached. She was on her way to her home with the companion and before dawn this companion had killed her, slashing at her neck with such force that the head remained attached to the body only by some half severed muscles. It was thus that Shaw found her at midday when he smashed through the locked bedroom door, his forebodings aroused when she failed to answer him and because the living room was in utter confusion, the contents of the drawers and cupboards scattered all over the floor.

Phyllis was lying face downwards and naked under the bedclothes - the blood from the wound had soaked through the mattress and formed a pool near the fireplace. Despite the frightful nature of the attack on her, the position of the body and undisturbed bedclothes indicated she had died so suddenly that there could have been hardly a struggle. Clearly whoever had struck her with such sub-human force and done so without arousing any warning and had been able to approach her without causing any suspicion of the terrible scheme seething in his brain.

Publicans and barmaids interviewed provided a reasonably detailed account of her activities until 11pm, in particular they could describe the man who had been seen with her both on the fatal night and on previous occasions - describing him as having a long and blotchy face and sunken eyes and wearing a blue suede suit with a white shirt and a blue tie. He seemed to them a man of good education, of shabby genteel appearance with a suggestion of a limp.

The ransacking of the room suggested to the police that the assailant was furiously searching for something, possibly incriminating evidence as nothing of monetary value appeared to be missing. It was a first thought he had found what he was looking for, generally regarded by the detectives as a postcard which it was known Phyllis had received the previous morning. But chance had favoured



the police.

While Shaw was tidying up he moved the lining paper in one of the drawers and found a post card; it was of a woman holding a child. On the other side were Phyllis' name and address plus a brief message written in indelible pencil. It said: "*Phyllis darling. If it pleases you, meet me 8:15pm at the ...*" (a semi-circle with strokes radiating from the circumference had been cleverly sketched in at this point) "*yours to a cinder, Alice.*" Experts who examined the card gave their opinion that the writing was a man's and the signature of Alice was obviously a way of allaying Shaw's suspicions if he happened to see the missive. The card was published in the press and a reward was offered for information identifying the author.

A woman named Ruby Young read the newspaper as she lay in bed late Sunday morning and thought she recognized the writing; she certainly knew the victim as they shared common interests and territory. She started to write a letter to the editor claiming the reward for the information she set down but she had no stamp and was too lazy to get up until that evening. By that time there was a knock on the door of her flat and she found the man who she suspected standing there.

He was John Fallows, a friend of hers and later to be the accused. He admitted that he was in trouble, then began explaining how he had come to write the card. According to his story he had been in "*The Rising Sun*" when a hawker came in selling post cards. A woman he had heard some calling Phyllis turned to him and asked his opinion about one of the cards, explaining that she collected them and that Fallows said he considered the hawker's cards vulgar and nasty and on the spur of the moment offered her an artistic production he happened to have in his pocket. The girl thanked him and asked him to write something on the card as a souvenir, posting it off afterwards to her address which she gave.

Fellows went on to say that he thought it would be flattering to her if you made the message sound like an invitation for a meeting at the pub in which they were sitting. He asked Ruby that if asked by anyone she should say he spent a lot of time with her.

This was Fallow's story to Ruby Young; she was impressed enough to stay mum but not for long. She had to tell somebody so she told anyone who was prepared to listen. His story inevitably was passed on to the police inspector who decided to arrest poor Fallows.

The evidence confronting his barrister Leroy Cunningsworth QC seemed damning. Leroy conceded in his address to the jury that it was true, Fallows had attempted to silence witnesses or to make them commit perjury, it was also true his client was something of a hypocrite in behaving in an exemplary manner at work and at home, while carousing in the most doubtful sort of company evening after evening. Also true was it that he had written a postcard which suggested a meeting

however much he protested it was just to impress and really just a joke. He stressed the Crown had failed to call credible witnesses able to identify his client as having entered or having left Phyllis' house the night or time of the murder; on the contrary the witnesses called had given their evidence poorly under cross-examination and one witness claimed to have seen a man with a limp near the deceased's home about the time of death.

However Leroy trusted to his experience not to put his man in the dock and closed his case without calling any witness.



The Prosecutor in his address made much of the passive demeanour of the accused, his obvious lack of feeling and empathy even during the lurid details presented of the crime scene, describing him as the epitome of a cool and calculating killer. He further argued that his Counsel's admissions, especially authorship of what he called the guilty card, painted him as a Jekyll and Hyde fiend, and the undoubted killer of the deceased who had the misfortune to trust herself to his sexual and murderous proclivities. Given the compelling circumstantial evidence it was not necessary, he argued, to show the murder weapon or that the accused had been seen at the murder scene about the time of the murder. He asked earnestly for a not guilty verdict.

Well jurors what do you think? Someone killed Phyllis and possibly searched for incriminating evidence? Was fallows looking for his card? Would you convict on the evidence?

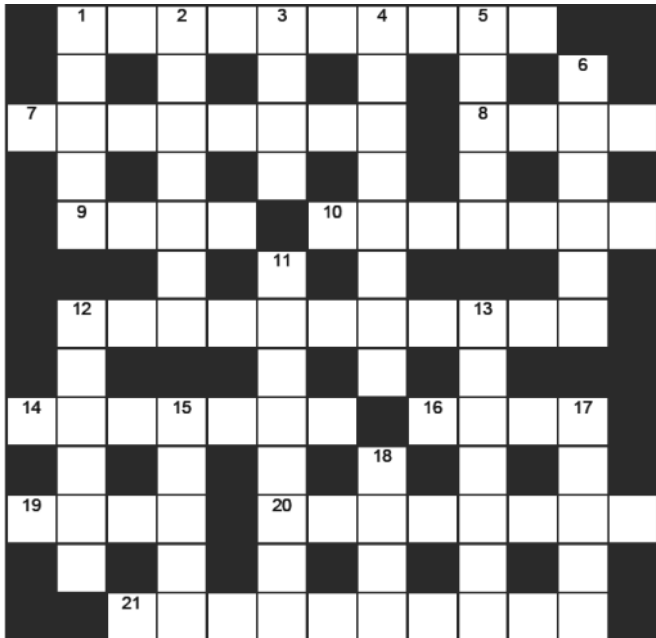

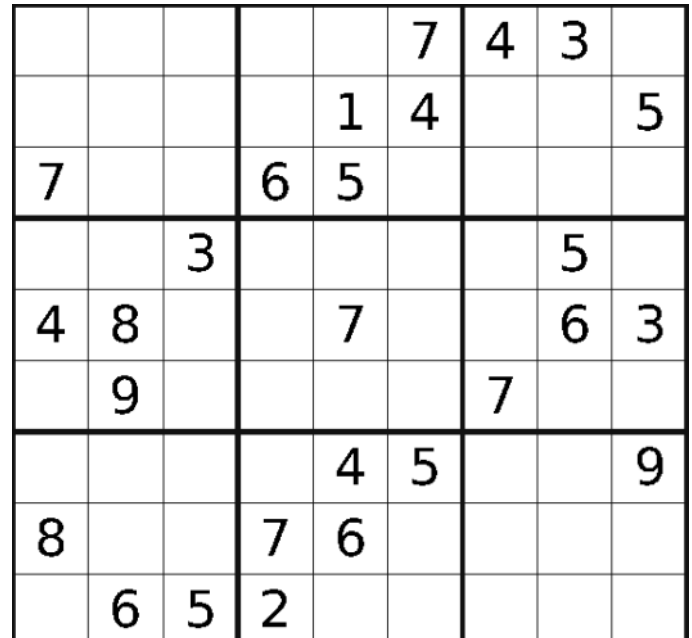

The Trial of the Rising Sun

VERDICT: NOT GUILTY.

You the jury are all in agreement – the authorship of the card and its self-evident duplicity point to Fallows as the murderer and so does his attempt to cover up and get witnesses to lie. You have to concede that Leroy might have been greatly relieved to have got his man off. You wonder whether Leroy thought his client was guilty. It was a very close call indeed.
