MONEY MANAGEMENT FOR SMALL BUSINESS

Six Easy Ways Small Business Owners can be Better Money Managers at Home and at Work.



If you're like most small business owners, you know how to make money but perhaps you're not so great at managing it. Usually this is because you're so

3. Make sure your accountant and lending consultant are on the same page

If you're in small business, it's crucial for your lending consultant and accountant to be on the same page to ensure both your tax minimisation and borrowing objectives are able to be met.

4. Set aside money for tax as you go

In the same way that you pay yourself, put your tax into a separate account such as a high interest account. This could be directly into your home loan or an offset account attached to your home loan. Why? Because if you are faced with having to borrow to pay an unexpected tax bill most lenders will knock you back. Many banks believe this is not an acceptable purpose for lending.

5. How to use equity in your home for small business purposes

If you are going to use equity in your home to fund your business, you can either take out a business loan using your home as security or the loan facility may be just taken out in your name. If it's in your name, make sure you discuss this with your accountant and have the necessary structure in place so that you can claim this interest.



6. Why planning ahead matters

Most lenders will want to see two years' worth of tax returns from any self-employed borrower. So, if you are a small business owner in the wealth building phase of your life, it helps to have two strong years leading up to any planned property purchase. Remember, these returns are good for up to 18 months after the end date. For example, a June 30, 2016 tax return can be used to evidence your income up until December 2018.

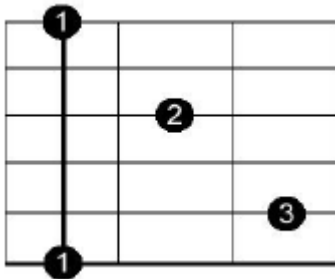


STRIKING A CHORD

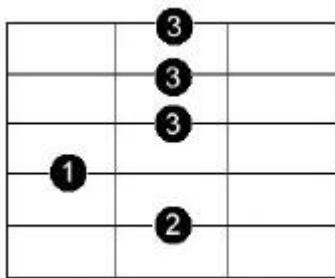
For seasoned guitar players, or those of you who enjoy a casual strum, local guitar teacher **Dean Luke**, shares tips, advice and news about all things guitar.

12 BAR BLUES PART 2 - 7TH & 9TH CHORDS

Today we will be looking at playing a 12 bar blues progression in the key of A with 7th chords and 9th chords, starting with an A7 barre chord that is played at the 5th fret. Play this A7 chord with a shuffle feel for 4 bars.



Now play a D9 chord starting on the D note on the 5th string at the 5th fret. When playing this chord use your 3rd finger to bar the 3rd, 2nd and 1st strings in the 5th fret. Play this D9 chord with a shuffle feel for 2 bars. Now change back to the A7 barre chord and play it with a shuffle feel for 2 bars.



Then play an E9 chord starting on the E note on the 5th string at the 7th fret. Play this E9 chord with a shuffle feel for 1 bar. Now play the D9 chord with a shuffle feel for 1 bar, change to the A7 barre chord and play that with a shuffle feel for 1 bar, then change back to the E9 chord and play it with a shuffle feel for 1 bar. Then simply repeat :)

What's Cooking?

Leek, Chicken & Corn & Mini Pies

What you Need:

- 4 sheets ready rolled puff pastry
- 1 leek sliced finely
- 4 chicken thigh fillets
- 1/2 cup corn kernels
- Handful of chopped fresh flat leaf parsley
- 2 large fresh sage leaves chopped finely
- 3 dessert spoons of plain flour
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/4 cup butter



What you Do:

Sauté the leeks and chicken in butter and a little olive oil. Add the corn and herbs and let it all enjoy each other's company for a few minutes. Sprinkle the flour over the top of the pie ingredients and stir through. Quickly add the milk and stir it thoroughly while it forms into a thick béchamel sauce. Season with salt and freshly ground black pepper. Set pie mix aside while you prepare pie trays. Cut each pastry sheet into 4. Brush two x 6 hole pie trays with olive oil and then line with pastry. Spoon in pie mixture and fold the edges of the pastry over to form cute little parcels. Cook for about 25 minutes at 190°C or until golden. Once cooked take them out of the oven and let them sit for a minute or two allowing the pies time to collect their thoughts. Serve with a delicious home made chutney or dead horse if you prefer.

Get GROWing

Ideas & tips from a
time poor gardener

Slime Show

There is a slimy predator in the garden at this time of year wreaking havoc on fruiting trees such as pears, plums, cherries and apples. But believe it or not it's only a baby. It's the larvae of the black sawfly (caliroa cerasi) and it is a living and literal example of a vicious circle.

The adult saw fly lays its eggs on the leaves of the fruit trees and over a short period of time the eggs turn into slimy slugs. They then spend the next few weeks literally sucking the life out of the leaves of the trees; if left unchecked they can skeletonise a tree in a few months. Once they have sated their alien like appetite they drop to the ground in a drunken revelry and manage to dig into the soil. They then cleverly turn into adults (saw flies) and start the cycle all over again.

So how does one deal with this Kafkaesque scenario?



If you have the time (and eyesight) you can manually pick them off the leaves and squish them between your fingers. This method is truly disgusting but strangely satisfying at the same time. Another method is to fling wood ash over the tree as the fine ash particles stick to the gooey larvae and they dehydrate and die. Obviously, stand up wind if you decide upon this method. I've tried it several times but even on a still day I end up looking like an extra from a 1980's Michael Jackson video. I've also heard that spraying the tree with a detergent solution can be effective. Likewise there are a bunch of nasty chemicals you can purchase; but remember that all purpose chemical sprays will kill the good karma bugs as well. So instead, perhaps you could try planting some flowering shrubs or annuals beneath the fruit trees to attract friendly critters who might find saw flies delicious.

At the end of the day, I don't really know the answer; like everything in gardening it's trial and error. But try and remain vigilant and check your trees now before the suckers take hold. It's one of those problems that won't go away if you ignore it.

Shooting Your Way To A Good Story

A large number of my non game playing friends have complained that they don't like games because they feel that games are superficial and shallow. They complain that gameplay is repetitive and there is nothing thought provoking other than wondering what the next target is or how can I kill it faster. If games were more like a book or a film then they would be interested. At some level I'm inclined to agree, but games are evolving and becoming deeper. However, games may be emulating books or films they still wouldn't want to read.



So here is my very personal view and I'm sure it may not apply to the bulk of game players. For me the gameplay is the most important thing but after that, for me to enjoy a game the story comes a close second. There are only a few games that stay with me long after others have become an amalgam of the thousands of games I have played over the past 30 something years.

These games have both a great story and a truly immersive world. These games emotionally connect with you at a deeper level, they transport you into a narrative that paints such a detailed world that you are happy to inhabit it for 100's of hours.

However what you have to keep in mind is that games are about the doing, not the watching or the reading. The player is asked to do stuff, not sit back passively and let the experience wash over them. The doing needs to be compelling or the player won't play. This

unfortunately tends to lend itself to a genre of story that lives in a world of doing. High drama and action are the 'go to' when game designers are looking for exciting gameplay. It is unlikely that a detailed study of dysfunctional personal relationships will sit comfortably with addictive gameplay. Well it might in the future but nobody to date has worked out the 'doing' component of that sort of game.

So if you are looking for a game with a great story then there are a few recommendations. Try *The Last of Us*, any of the *Bioshock* games or the *Fallout* series. And any of the games from the studio, *Telltale* (the name is a bit of a giveaway) are worth a look. *Red Dead Redemption* if you would like to live in the Wild West and *Grand Theft Auto* if you prefer Scarface over Wyatt Earp.

There are definitely games with deeper stories that do study the human condition; you just have to accept there may be some gun play along the way.

Postcard from Kenya



In our new travel series, journey with Tracey and Francis from *Overland Travel Adventures* to visit the diverse communities and lifestyles of East Africa. Community development projects, stunning scenery and amazing wildlife are all just part of the journey.

Why East Africa Is the Perfect Family Destination

School holidays roll around four times a year and each time you want to keep your kids entertained and once in a while treat them to something really special. Well here today, I'm presenting the ultimate school holiday treat for the whole family! Often, family travel focuses on a destination suitable for children but can be a bit of a drag for the parents. East Africa is NOT such a destination – it offers plenty for everyone from your primary-school-aged son to his grandmother.



East Africa has so many activities for all ages. Many people just think of a typical safari, looking at animals from a safari vehicle. When parents are considering a holiday for their young children, spending days in a car does not sound attractive. But there's so much more! At Lake Naivasha

you can go cycling in Hells Gate National Park. In the Maasai Mara and Serengeti you can go in a hot air balloon. Many lodges have swimming pools to break up a big day of game drives. You can head up to a beautiful viewpoint for a sundowner in most places you might be in the region. Walking safaris are available in Central Kenya, Lake Naivasha and Lake Eyasi in Tanzania. Or perhaps a boat ride at Lake Baringo, Lake Victoria, Lake Kivu (in Rwanda), or on the Nile River in Uganda. At the source of the Nile in Jinja, Uganda, the teenagers can go white-water rafting downstream while the elders relax on a lunch cruise upriver!

I mentioned earlier that parents tend to worry about their young kids spending full days in a car. What if they get bored? What if they need a toilet? Oh it could just be a disaster. Wrong! There are ways to make game drives fun and entertaining with games or a scavenger hunt or get them to fill out a field guide if they are a bit older. That will keep them engaged and interested in finding the next animal. You could have prizes for the most obscure find for the day. And anyway, the animals you are seeing are lions and elephants and giraffes! One family took their two children aged 3 and 5 on a safari and they had prepared their guide that they may have to cut things short if the kids became ratty. But it never happened. The children were thrilled with seeing the animals and lasted the whole day!

Meeting local people and learning how they live is a

fantastic experience for all generations. But in East Africa there is a lot of issues and life is really different to what we are used to in the West. We have witnessed profound impact on teenagers especially when they have interacted with kids their own age living in the slums or in a Maasai village. Visiting community-based organisations and seeing their projects can inspire young people to start thinking how they can make a difference in this world. We have had family groups visit schools and donate books. Other families have visited traditional villages and it's so fun to see the children playing together despite a language barrier.

So if you are starting to think that it might be OK for finding things to do, but now you start thinking about the logistics. Where will you stay? How will you travel? Again, East Africa has you covered. Many accommodation places have family rooms. We also understand that travelling with a family can be expensive, so if you are travelling on a budget then consider a camping trip. It is really exciting camping in the national parks listening to the sounds of the bush around you at night! As for transport, there are a range of vehicle sizes, depending on how many you are. A typical safari van or Land Cruiser seats 6-7 passengers but if you are looking to bring the extended family for a multi-generational trip, you might hire an overland truck.

The biggest concern for families considering coming to East Africa is safety and security. When you book through a reputable tour operator, you will be fully escorted the whole time by knowledgeable local guides. By booking a full safari package and paying up front for everything, you do not have to carry so much cash on you. And remember the national parks have never really been a target for terrorists or criminals – big cities are much more lucrative for them. On a safari you will be spending most of your time in national parks and minimal time in cities so your risk of encountering these bad guys is reduced.



So what are you waiting for? It's time to build amazing memories together. You might use it to celebrate a special occasion – for example we had a family group reunite in Kenya to celebrate the grandfather's 70th birthday. Regardless, a family holiday to East Africa is a bucket list event no one will ever forget.

THE MURDER OF SUNNY VON BULOW

"The very rich are different from you and I," F. Scott Fitzgerald to Hemingway. "Yes," Hemmingway said, "they have more money."

I suppose, as a retired lawyer, I tend to gravitate to lawyer movies for entertainment but without doubt one of my all time favourite movies is *Reversal of Fortune*, a 1990 movie starring Glenn Close as Sunny von Bulow, Jeremy Irons as Claus von Bulow and Ron Silver as Alan Dershowitz.

Jeremy Irons, another all time favourite got the Academy award for his performance as Sunny's husband. While researching for my series of mini stories of famous unsolved celebrity murders I stumbled across the movie, now maybe forgotten by many, as having ideal subject matter for my current story.

In the movie the story is narrated by Sunny who is in a coma after falling into diabetic shock after a Christmas party. Her husband, the dissolute European aristocrat Claus von Bulow is charged with attempting to murder her by giving the hypoglycemic Sunny an overdose of insulin.

What, and who, put Sunny into darkness? It is a question that has been examined through the course of two lengthy criminal trials involving Claus as the accused and several lawsuits. But the courts, as the famous jurist Oliver Wendell Holmes reminded us, *dispense law not justice*.

Sunny died on 6 December 2006 having been comatose for 28 years.

The strained relationship with his wife and his cold and haughty personal demeanor lead most people to conclude that Claus was guilty. In need of an innovative defense, Claus turns to law professor Alan Dershowitz who is initially convinced of Claus' guilt, but takes the case on appeal because Claus agrees to fund Dershowitz's defense of two poor black teenagers accused of capital murder. Employing his law students as workers, Dershowitz proceeds to defend Claus, wrestling with his client's unnerving personal style and questions his client's guilt or innocence.

This in brief is the story of people who had more money

than most of us could ever use. It could just as easily have been a fairy tale, for it has princes and princesses and glittering soirees, and the charmed existence of those who live as far from cares as any in this world.

Instead it is a tale of greed, of lust and betrayal, and perhaps not just attempted murder as Sunny remained "alive" for a long time after the results of the trials, just plain outright murder.

For almost 28 years after becoming comatose the princess in this story slept under the spell of an evil potion, a sleep from which all the princes in the world could not wake her. She had lain in a coma since December 1980. In that time a radio played softly in her nursing home room, and there was a vase of freesias,

fragrant and freshly cut. So far as anyone knew she had no thoughts, no memories, and no dreams. Except for the purely mechanical functions that kept her breathing and circulating her blood, her brain appeared to have died.

The pale figure on the bed is the shell of a woman who was once a striking beauty, but who possessed a great deal more than good looks. In her day Sunny Von Bulow was one of the most dazzling – and the richest – of the East Coast of America's debutantes; the bride in a story book marriage to an Austrian prince, the pampered heiress to a vast fortune. To the world at large she became no more than a famous victim.

Whatever the truth about Claus, after the marriage he became fantastically rich, gave up his job and settled down to the job of a full time husband. With his chilly demeanor, immaculate dress sense and outdated mannerisms, he could easily have passed for an over educated funeral director.

Sunny unfortunately brought little sunshine to the marriage, she wore a frozen smile and on social occasions often departed without explanation. Claus became bored with her and a pall fell over the couple's once charming life. Claus started to mess around with other women and to spend more and more of Sunny's money on expensive pursuits including financing Broadway shows and expensive art. Still, Sunny remained generous and Claus remained a major beneficiary under her Will.

In the early evening of December 26, Sunny was having an after dinner eggnog with her family (there were three children) when her son, then twenty years old, noticed that she appeared to rapidly weaken and her speech began to slur. Her voice trailed off to nothing. Claus was not in the room at the time, and the young man helped his mother to her bedroom. Sunny's personal maid, Maria, went in to check on her at about 8.00 pm. She reported that Sunny appeared to be asleep, and that Claus was in the bedroom, still awake and fully dressed. In fact Sunny was only days away from a crisis that would lead her to death's door.

Because it is a natural substance and difficult to trace, insulin can be - and has been used - as a means of murder. For that matter, it has also been used as a means of suicide.

Claus came to be charged with attempted murder. The state's case was largely circumstantial. The prosecutor was relatively junior and lightweight. No one had seen Claus inject Sunny with insulin, but it seemed clear he had the motive, the means and the opportunity. Claus had an expensive legal line up expected of a rich defendant. It was apparent the defense had the resources to outspend, outgun and outwait the state. The jury failed to convict and Claus was tried again. At the second trial the defense called eight medical experts, all world renowned university professors, who testified that the two comas were not caused by insulin, but by a combination of

ingested (not injected) drugs, alcohol, and her chronic health conditions. The jury however were convinced of his guilt and rendered a guilty verdict. Claus appealed his conviction for attempted murder.

Dershowitz and his other attorneys hammered on the evidence of Sunny von Bulow's excessive drug use. The Appeal court dismissed the conviction on several grounds, some technical. Claus was a free, very rich man. However his wealth was to become substantially reduced. Sunny's family were not happy with the decision and two of his three children, Ala and Alexander, acting by court order to represent their mother's interests, brought a civil action against Claus. The third child, Cosima, had been supportive of Claus and had been disinherited. The matter was settled out of court. Claus agreed to divorce Sunny, give up his right to inherit from her and to leave the country. In return Cosima was reinstated to the will and was entitled to receive a third share of the mother's estate with her siblings sharing the balance.

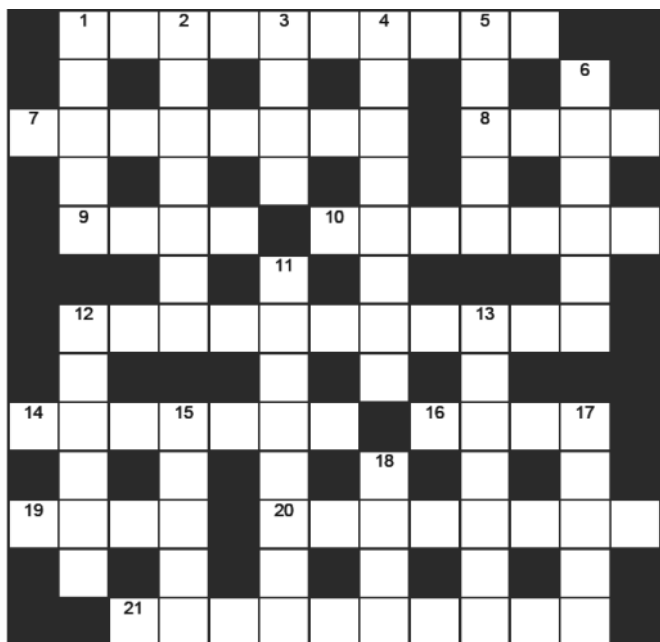
Claus retired comfortably in London near Cosima, doting on his grandchildren and writing occasional reviews for the *Sunday Times*. He remained estranged from his other children. Sunny, as we know, died in December 2006. As I said earlier, a great lawyer movie but perhaps a result that leaves a bitter taste in the mouths of many who believe that it is often guilty, rich, celebrity defendants and their dream team lawyers who can bend the criminal justice system to achieve a favorable result. Not a too fanciful view I think in many such cases - take the instance of the trial of celebrity O.J. Simpson as a good example. But maybe that's for another story!

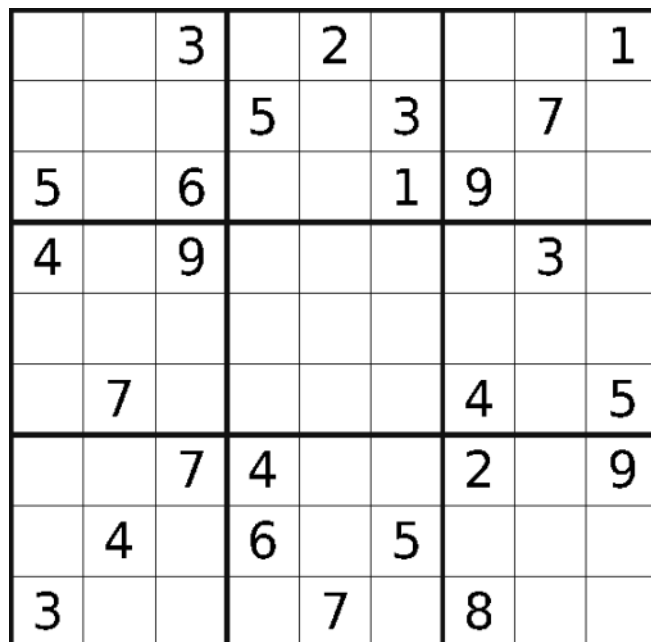

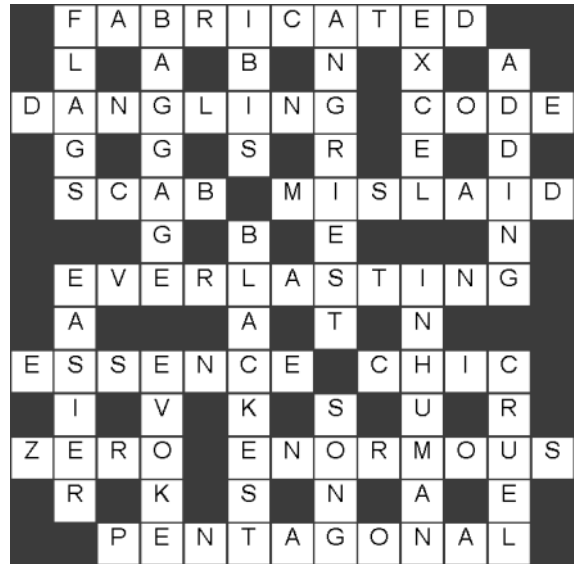

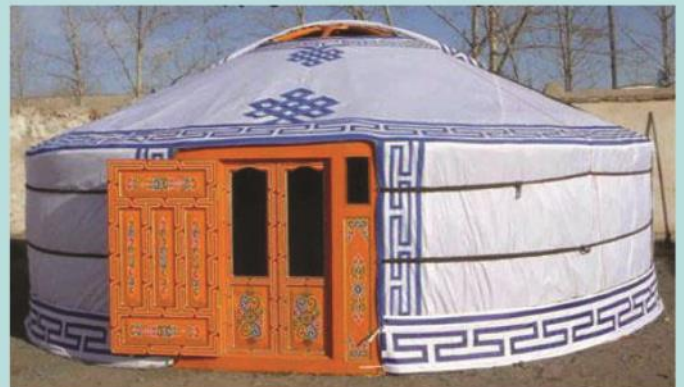
